




COMPREHENSIVE APPROACH CORE COMPONENTS

TRIBAL CODES & ORDINANCES



OPTIONS FOR IMPLEMENTATION

- Will you complete all aspects of sex offender registration and community notification?
- Will you opt to work cooperatively with other state or tribal jurisdictions to complete all aspects of registration?
- Will you delegate your authority to implement
- SORNA to another jurisdiction?

BANISHMENT OR EXCLUSION

- Will you banish or exclude sex offender?

TRIBAL COURT CONVICTIONS

- Will offenders have access to public defenders?
- How will you tier offenders who have been convicted in tribal court?
- How will you address tribal convictions upon recapture?

SPECIAL CODE & POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

- What goes into a code is legally binding whereas policies are more administrative and are more flexible to amend in the future.
- Consider that codes should reflect what is required during registration and notification and policy better reflects how tasks are to be completed.

MONITORING OFFENDERS TECHNIQUES AND TECHNOLOGY

ACTIVE CASE SUPERVISION STEPS

- Programs should reflect the Law and Order Codes and have supporting policies and procedures.
- Intake, risk assessment, establish rules of supervision
 - Intake checklist:
 - Residence assessment
 - Employment evaluation
 - Sexual history questionnaire
 - Record review

ACTIVE CASE SUPERVISION STEPS (CONT'D.)

- Intake, risk assessment, establish rules of supervision (Cont'd.)
 - Establish initial rules of supervision
 - Standard community supervision rules
 - PLUS sex offender rules
 - Levels of supervision required

SUCCESS FACTORS

- Stable residence and employment
- Strong connections to family and mature role models
- active progress with appropriate sex offender treatment

ADDRESSING CHALLENGES

- Requires
 - collaboration and commitment to common goals
 - training on working with offenders conducting risk assessments, and identifying risk factors
 - identification of specific risk factors and needs for the local community as well as individual offenders

ADDRESSING CHALLENGES

- Identify specific components of MOU's
 - protocol for working together in the field
 - sharing and forwarding of information
- Identify specific resources each officer may have available to them
